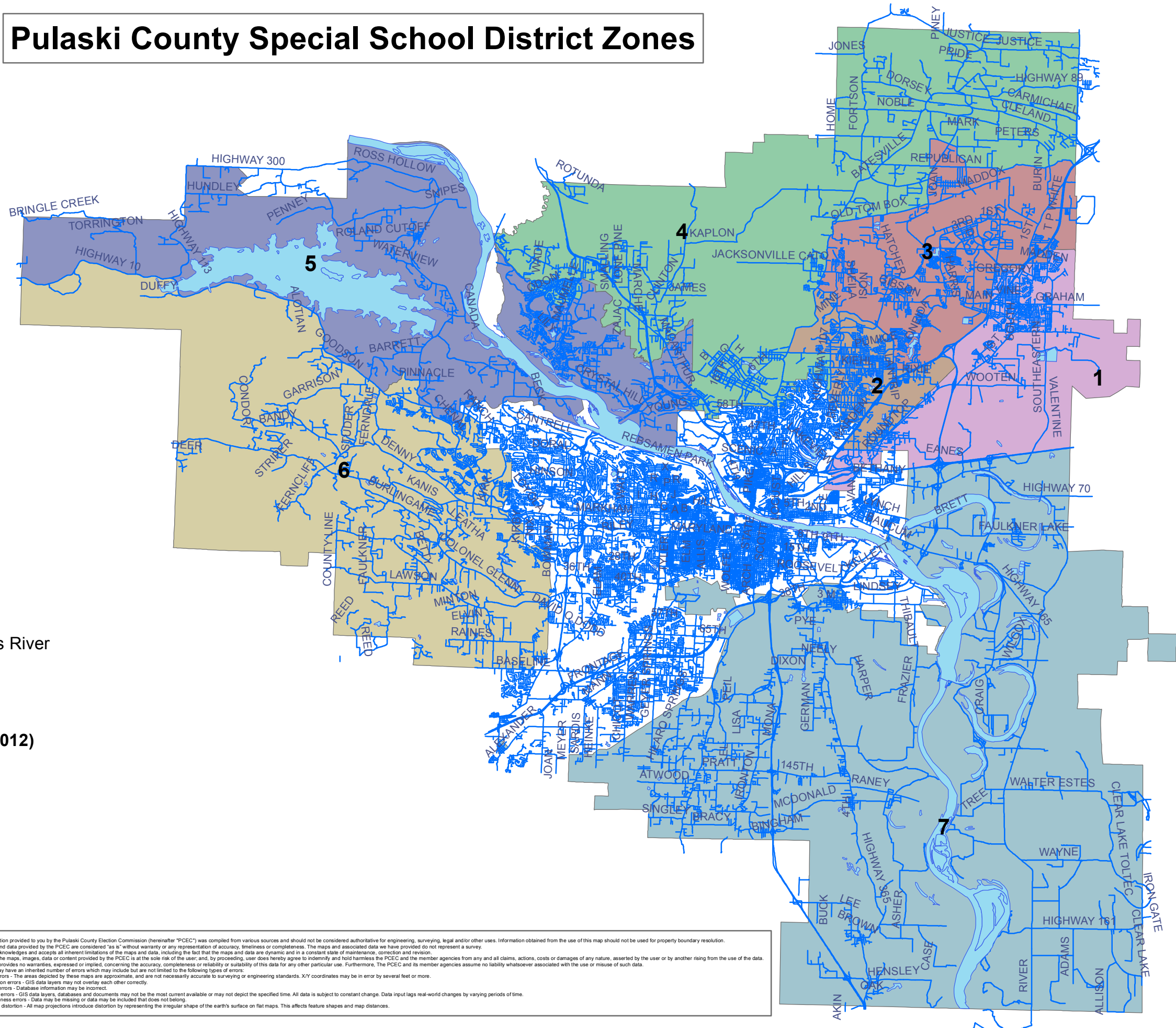





Pulaski County Special School District Zones









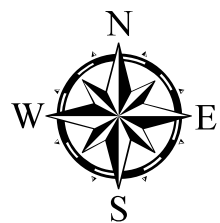
