If the bonds for one or more of the purposes are approved and one of such purposes is the Refunding, there will be levied a one-half of one percent (.50%) sales and use tax that will extend and replace the existing 2018 Tax for the sole purpose of retiring bonds. The net collections of the tax remaining after the State of Arkansas deducts its administrative charges and required rebates will be used solely to retire the bonds and obligations of the City with respect thereto. The effective date of the 2026 Tax will be the day following the date the existing 2018 Tax expires.
