As provided in Amendment No. 74, the Statewide Uniform Rate replaces a portion of the existing rate of tax levied by this School District and available for maintenance and operation of schools in this District. The total proposed school tax levy of 40.70 mills includes 25.00 mills specifically voted for general maintenance and operation, 0.9 mill voted for dedicated maintenance and operation dedicated specifically for technology purposes, and 14.80 mills voted for debt service previously voted as a continuing levy pledged for the retirement of existing bonded indebtedness. The surplus revenues produced each year by the debt service millage may be used by the District for other school purposes.

The total proposed school tax levy of 40.70 mills represents the same rate presently being collected.

The bonds described below that are approved may be combined into a single issue or may be issued in series from time to time. If the bonds for one or more of the purposes are approved and one of such purposes is the Refunding, there will be levied a one-half of one percent (.50%) sales and use tax that will extend and replace the existing 2018 Tax for the sole purpose of retiring bonds. The net collections of the tax remaining after the State of Arkansas deducts its administrative charges and required rebates will be used solely to retire the bonds and obligations of the City with respect thereto. The effective date of the 2026 Tax will be the day following the date the existing 2018 Tax expires. The rate of taxation will be one-half of one percent (.50%) even if bonds for more than one purpose are approved. No bonds will be issued for any purpose unless the bonds for the Refunding are also approved.

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$3,050,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of refunding the City's outstanding Sales and Use Tax Capital Improvement Bonds, Series 2018 and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 2:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$3,860,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction, acquisition and equipping of new, or improvements and repairs to existing, streets, roads, sidewalks, trails, curbs, gutters, ditches, drainage facilities, overpasses, bridges, culverts, pipes, stormwater drainage and detention facilities, and related structures, including particularly, without limitation, any necessary land, easement and right-of-way acquisition and related intersection, interchange and interconnection improvements, utility adjustments, lighting and traffic control devices and improvements therefor, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 3:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$5,390,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction, acquisition, equipping and improvements for a new building in which there will be located an indoor therapy pool, locker rooms, and additional parking, and related improvements on the premises of the Maumelle Center on the Lake, together with furniture, fixtures, and related equipment of all types, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 4:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$5,190,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction, acquisition, equipping and improvements for a joint training facility for the City's police and fire departments including, but not limited to, a building, indoor shooting range, burn tower, classrooms, secure vehicle parking and storage facility, furniture, fixtures, and related equipment of all types, together with acquisition of real property for any and all structures and improvements and any and all other related improvements, furniture, fixtures, and related equipment of all types, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 5:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$8,450,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction, acquisition, equipping and improvements for the design, engineering, construction, acquisition, and equipping of capital improvements for the City's fire department facilities including, but not limited to, a new fire substation, furniture, fixtures, and related facilities and equipment of all types to be located in the White Oak Crossing area of Maumelle, Arkansas, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds and in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 6:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$3,220,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction and reconstruction, acquisition, equipping, and improvements for the existing boardwalk, gazebo and fountain at Lake Valencia, including electrical systems, paths, trails and related improvements, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.

QUESTION 7:

FOR or AGAINST an issue of bonds of the City of Maumelle, Arkansas in the maximum principal amount of \$5,100,000 which, together with other available moneys, for the purposes of financing all or a portion of the costs of the design, engineering, construction, acquisition, equipping, and installation of artificial turf on a portion of the City's athletic fields for baseball, softball and soccer and related drainage improvements, and to pay the costs of issuing the bonds, and, in order to pay the bonds, the levy and pledge of a one-half of one percent (0.50%) local sales and use tax within the City.
